BOARD OF HOUSING COMMISSIONERS RESOLUTION NO 2014-24

Extending the Restriction on Intake of Applications with Limited Intake of Applications for Public Housing

WHEREAS, the Board of Housing Commissioners adopted the Admissions and Continued Occupancy Policy (ACOP) of the Albuquerque Housing Authority (AHA) to establish an intake process for applicants seeking admission to the AHA Public Housing Program and the AHA Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher rental assistance program;

WHEREAS, the AHA ACOP (Chapter 4.7) indicates that AHA may choose to accept applications in a limited capacity and for a limited period of time as the need arises.

WHEREAS, the policy since December 5, 2013 has been to accept a very limited number of new applications for admission and that narrow criteria being only for Involuntary Displacement, the Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing Program, and/or Nursing Home Transition vouchers.

WHEREAS, the Public Housing Program is estimated to have less than a two-year waiting time for a majority of unit sizes and the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program continues to have a wait time of three to four years.

WHEREAS, AHA aspires to serve people in need as fast as possible and to keep the waiting list for these programs as short as possible, and the goal is that the waiting lists never be more than two years in length.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE AHA BOARD OF HOUSING COMMISSIONERS, the governing body of the AHA that:

The Board finds that:

1. This new Resolution supersedes the previously adopted AHA Resolution 2014-18
2. There is a well-documented shortage of safe, sanitary and decent housing units currently for rent at rates affordable to low income and extremely low income persons in the City of Albuquerque.
3. To better serve our community by being wise stewards of limited public resources, AHA will accept applications for Public Housing only via online application from October 21, 2014 through December 22, 2014 after which time applications will not be accepted. Generally, AHA will not be accepting applications for the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher program. However, AHA will continue to accept new applications, both now and after December 22, 2014 for admission from applicants that must meet at least one (1) of these three (3) narrow criteria:

1) Applicant qualifies for an Involuntary Displacement preference (as defined in the AHA ACOP, Chapter 4.4), and/or



2) Applicant is an eligible Military Veteran of the United States of America (USA), who is homeless or at-risk of becoming homeless, and who has also qualified for and is admitted by the United States (U.S.) Department of Veteran Affairs (VA) to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (VASH) Program, and/or

3) Applicant is a person with a documented disability who qualifies for a special use Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher for disabled individuals transitioning from living full time as a patient in a skilled nursing facility (i.e. in-patient in a hospital, nursing home, medical care facility or rehabilitation center) to living in an independent living setting in the community.

These three (3) narrow criteria for acceptance of a new application for admission are in addition to the regular criteria for admission listed in the AHA ACOP, which will also still apply to all applicants for admission.

And be it further resolved that: the intake of applications for admission to either the AHA Public Housing Program and/or the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher rental assistance programs may or may not be opened to new applicants in the future, either partially or in full. The intake of applications may be opened with additional eligibility criteria to apply for admission being added on by AHA. The eligibility criteria could be, but are not limited to: only accepting applications for the Public Housing program waiting lists or the Section 8 Housing program waiting lists, or age limits, household size limits, income limits, disability status, work requirements, limits on the amount of time to live in a unit or participate in an AHA housing assistance program, Family Self Sufficiency (FSS) program participation requirement, etc. These new limits would be imposed by AHA to carefully restrict and limit the intake of any new applications for admission, to achieve an agency policy goal.

And be it further resolved that: the Board reserves the right to change this policy as it sees fit in the future.
