RESOLUTION NO. 2015-05

**REGARDING THE CREATION OF AN AD-HOC COMMUNITY WORKING GROUP AT THE  
ALBUQUERQUE HOUSING AUTHORITY**

**WHEREAS**, the Albuquerque Housing Authority (AHA) Board of Housing Commissioners is charged with the oversight of the AHA.

**WHEREAS**, the City of Albuquerque has nearly 60,000 households with an income of less than \$25,000 per year.

**WHEREAS**, these households experience a wide variety of issues with regards to obtaining decent, safe and affordable housing.

**WHEREAS**, at least 1,287 people experience homelessness each night in Albuquerque, according to the most recent Point-in-Time count.

**WHEREAS**, the cost to our community of a homeless person far exceeds the cost of housing.

**WHEREAS**, AHA has limited financial resources to serve this population and seeks to be the most effective steward of its resources.

**WHEREAS**, AHA is especially concerned about serving the most vulnerable members in our community and assisting them in finding permanent affordable housing solutions.

**WHEREAS**, AHA shares the concern of many of our community leaders regarding those who are homeless.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE AHA BOARD OF HOUSING COMMISSIONERS,**

1. To create an ad-hoc working group to study how to best serve the needs of our most vulnerable residents.
2. That the ad-hoc working group shall be composed of one AHA Commissioner, one member of the AHA Executive team, one staff member of the City of Albuquerque's Department of Family and Community Services, and two representatives from agencies that serve people experiencing homelessness in the City of Albuquerque. A representative from the Albuquerque City Council or staff will be invited to participate.
3. That this ad-hoc working group will meet on a monthly basis to establish ways to better meet the needs of Albuquerque's most vulnerable residents with the resources that are available.
4. That the ad-hoc working group will report to the Board of Housing Commissioners on a quarterly basis in writing regarding its progress.




And be it further resolved that: the Board reserves the right to change the mission and constitution of the ad-hoc working group as it sees fit in the future.
